Independent Examiner's Report

This report on the financial statements of the PCC for the year ended 31 December 2013, which are set out on pages 13 and 14, is in respect of an examination carried out in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 ("the Regulations") and section 43 of the Charities Act 1993 ("the Act").

Respective responsibilities of the PCC and the examiner

As members of the PCC you are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. You consider that the audit requirement of the Regulations and section 43(2) of the Act do not apply. It is my responsibility to issue this report on those financial statements in accordance with the terms of the Regulations.

Basis of this report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 43(7)(b) of the Act and to be found in the *Church Guidance*, 2006 edition, issued by the Finance Division of the Archbishops' Council. That examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the PCC and a comparison of the accounts with those records. It also includes considering any unusual items or disclosures in the financial statements and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Review of the year

This year we have continued to try and work out what it means to follow our vision statement of: 'Seeing lives restored through Jesus, in a renewed space, as we have fun together'. It was felt that this captured some of the focus God is giving us over the next few years. A highlight of the year was the 'Christ the King Banquet' held in November as a celebration of what God has done at the church.

Services

Christ Church continued to have a variety of services throughout the year, serving both those who wish to worship in a more traditional way, and those who wish to worship in a more contemporary way. The year has included looking through the book of James, examining the life of Elijah and focusing on how our faith and work relate to one another. A highlight of the year was interviewing various church members in Sunday services about their faith in their work place.

House Groups

House groups have continued to meet in various locations around Chester, with a new house group beginning in Rossett.

Children's Work

'Gems' (for ages 0-7) has continued to run on Sunday mornings, run largely by the children's parents, but also significantly helped by students. At points throughout the year, depending on leader availability and number of children, there has also been a group for older children on a Sunday morning that has met upstairs in the Mission House.



Youth Work

Our youth work continues to thrive, led for the first half of the year by Helen Ince and Kat Todd, working with us on their placements from the university. For the second part of the year, Kat (remaining as an intern) was joined by Sam Rourke, also working on his placement from the university and Rosie Adcock (an intern). The activities in the year have included D'biz, Homework café, 6th form coffee, girl's group and Sunday morning youth. A highlight of the year has been the setting up of a Thursday evening youth group Bible study in Rossett.

Community Work

The church has been blessed in its community work with Matthew Reilly, initially as a Light Project student, and latterly as a volunteer community worker. A highlight from the community work this year was the annual fun-day, helped hugely by the good weather that day! A second highlight has been the beginning of 'community leaders' lunches' (once a term) where local leaders are hosted by Christ Church to a lunch at which to connect with each other.

Students Work

Our ministry with students has continued to grow. A few highlights for 2013 – firstly the excellent intern team (Rosie Adcock, Kat Todd and James Leavy) who have coordinated our student ministry, including the fresher's fair and regular student coffees. Secondly, the student weekend away to Edale in the Peak District, which enabled students to grow in relationship and deepen their faith. Thirdly, the 'hot potato lunches' that have happened after some of the Sunday services that have allowed a deeper discussion into issues specifically relating to students.

Renewed space project.

A Renewed space is a key element of our current vision for Christ Church to assist us in welcoming people to our building and adapting it to improve the worship experience for both congregations. The current project focuses on three main elements: 1) building a platform and providing new projection equipment at the front of church, 2) replacing the current inner main entrance doors with glass doors and glass surround, 3) the removal of excess furniture to allow the building to more easily be converted to a social community space.

The project aimed to raise £17,000 to complete these works. At the time of writing it is fantastic news that we have now raised the money needed and we are hugely grateful to all those who have been able to contribute to make this vision a reality. We are also in the final stages of the approval process to undertake the works so that it is expected all works will be completed by the start of the autumn university term in September 2014.

Internship

As part of our role in connecting and discipling students we believe we have a unique calling in equipping young people for ministry and leadership in the wider church. Our voluntary leadership internship program is a key part of this vision. During this year we have said good bye to our first intern Alex and expanded the programme welcoming three new interns in September: Rosie, Kat and James. We are hugely grateful to our interns for taking a year out to work as part of our leadership team and for the amazing things they are doing at Christ Church.

Some of the highlights so far have been the setting up of an older children's cell group and teenage youth work, work with the Drop-In cafe and community youth work, our student programme and student weekend away and the development of our worship teams as well



as the countless tasks and pastoral visits they undertake. Ministry and theological training this year has taken place on Mondays in partnership with the 'North West Training Partnership', St Melitus College Liverpool and the Light Project. This formal training, together with ministry responsibility and pastoral support, we hope encourages, stretches and equips our interns for ministry and leadership during their year with us and beyond.

Visiting Team

A number of frail and elderly members of our congregation continue to receive communion regularly in their homes, in hospital and in residential care. They are happy to support Christ Church through their regular giving and are always eager to hear news of their friends. In the summer, we were delighted to be joined by Debra Clarke, who was licensed as a Pastoral Worker.

Sunday Drop-In Café

This has been a good year for the Sunday Drop-In Cafe which has been well supported by Church in prayer and generous donations of clothes, sleeping bags and gifts of money. Church funding was supplemented during the year by generous sponsorship from Tesco and currently from Sainsbury's and Waitrose. The highlight of this year was in December when over 30 guests sat down to Christmas Dinner with turkey, generously donated by Mr Malcolm Thomas of Cilcain Turkeys, roast potatoes, a full assortment of veg and very yummy puddings - with second helpings - produced on the day by all our cooks. Our rota of volunteers to provide soup, sandwiches and a warm welcome to vulnerable friends and neighbours in God's house remains strong and is growing.

Musical Worship

Worship at Christ Church continues to grow and we are blessed with many talented musicians that share their gifts for the glory of God. The 9.30 Service continues to benefit from the richness and variety of gifts of the expanded worship team. One of the highlights of the year was a rendition of 'Thine be the glory' on Easter Sunday, arranged by a team member for six hands at the piano and a solo trumpet, with the 11.00 worship group joining in for the finale. During the year two members of the team have started degree courses, one a BA in Music, the other a Foundation Degree in Church Music, and their developing skills and understanding are already helping to develop the shape of musical worship.

On the 28th and 29th of November, the 11.00 worship team attended a Worship Central conference during which we were enriched by teaching and worship that reminded us of the privilege it is to lead and renewed our passion for worship at Christ Church. Since December, we have been hosting monthly 'Open worship evenings' to allow new people within the church to become more easily connected with the worship team and to create more opportunities for worship outside of Sunday services.

One of the highlights of the Christmas season was the Christmas Carol service that involved 30 members from our two services in the Christmas choir and instrumental worship and gave opportunity for the congregation and musicians to share their love for Christ with the local community.



Fun Team

'Having fun together' continues to be an important part of Christ Church's focus, as we seek to build a community based on strong friendships amongst ourselves and with those we welcome into our family. The barn dance, the fun day and the 80's disco banquet were some of the highlights of the last 12 months, with the usual panicked planning that characterises Christ Church life and countered by an equally reliable army of volunteers pitching in to get the show on the road.

The fruit of this 'organised fun' is not in the event itself but in the connections that are made, bridges built and friendships that grow deep as fun is had. The tough realities of life do not escape us as a family, but having fun together continues to be a foundation for laughing together, grieving together and growing together in Christ.

Fabric Report

This past year we have consolidated maintenance of the Church and begun work on the Mission House. A small repair was made to the roof over the South aisle, the roof was inspected, and all the gutters were cleared just before Christmas. The Mission House has seen some major improvements including a new boiler replacing all our heating and hot water needs. The cupboard doors in the downstairs room have been turned from sliding doors into a more standard opening arrangement and various shelves put in where old tanks and the boiler were. We have also had the central heating system flushed out and obtained a certificate for it.

Looking forward to 2014

As we continue to grow numerically in 2014 we are hoping to put structures in place that will allow this growth to be sustainable. For example, we hope to improve our communication and focus on small groups in the church.

We pray that we might also be able to continue renewing our church space, in line with our vision statement, by doing such things as installing glass doors, extending the platform and installing a new projector system.

We look forward to continuing to have fun together with a group going to the New Wine summer conference and enjoying together what is becoming an annual 'Christ the King Banquet'!



Annual Report (Continued)

Financial Review of the year

The finance team consists of three members, a treasurer (David Chirgwin), a book-keeper (Iona Taylor) and a giving coordinator (Helen Parker). The team aim to provide transparency of figures for both PCC and the congregation, an efficient and simple giving programme and accurate budgeting information to the PCC to enable them to make decisions.

During 2013 income was generated from giving, church fees and rental of rooms. Total net giving from the congregation during the year was £80,543 which showed a 12% decrease on 2012 (£91,286).

The gift aid reclaimable on giving in 2013 was £12,532 (2012 £14,418). This is roughly in line with the decrease in giving.

There were no Grants or Legacies received in 2013 (in 2012, £2,950 in Grants and £4,000 in Legacies were received).

Expenditure was £93,232 (2012 £102,449). The largest item of expense was the Parish Share which was £55,244 (2012 £53,605).

Other than running costs the further main areas of expenditure were on employee and intern costs as well as insurance and maintenance for our buildings.

In 2013, £2,500 (2012 £2,500) was set aside in the generosity fund, out of which £2,126 was distributed during the year (the fund allocation will be increased for 2014). The generosity fund was set up as a form of Outward Giving, in order to bless what God is doing beyond our ministries, but in line with our values and goals. This money has been able to bless a number of projects and individuals during 2013.

The budget for 2014 has been set by the PCC and agreed at the February 2014 meeting.

Accounting Policies

Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting regulations 2006 together with applicable accounting standards and SORP 2005.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for the valuation of investment assets which are shown at market value. The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities, to which the PCC is responsible by law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their affiliation to another body or those that are informal gatherings of Church members.

Funds

Endowment funds are funds, the capital of which must be maintained; only income arising from the investment of the endowment may be used either as restricted or unrestricted funds depending upon the purpose for which the endowment was established.

Restricted funds represent (a) Income from trusts or endowments which may be expended only on those restricted objects provided in the terms of the trust or bequest, and (b) donations or grants received for a specific object. The funds may be expended on the specific object for which they are given. Any balances remaining unspent at the end of the year must be carried forward as a balance of that fund.

Designated funds represent income which has been set aside for use for a specific purpose but are not legally restricted to be used for that purpose. Amounts identified as designated funds which are held in the general current account at the year-end were:

Vicarage Fund £2,000

Unrestricted funds are general funds which can be used for PCC ordinary purposes.

Incoming Reserves

Planned giving collections and donations are recognised when received. Tax refunds are recognised on an accruals basis at the end of the financial year when the appropriate amount is reclaimed from HM Revenue Customs.

Resources Expended

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding or constructive obligation on the PCC. The Diocesan Parish Share is accounted for when due.



Accounting Policies (Continued)

Amounts received specifically for mission are dealt with as restricted funds. All other expenditure is generally recognised when it is incurred and is accounted for gross.

Fixed Assets

Consecrated and benefice property is not included in the accounts in accordance with s.96 (2) (a) of the Charities Act 1993.

Movable church furnishings held by the vicar and church wardens on special trust for the PCC and which require a faculty for disposal are inalienable property, listed in the church inventory, which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For anything acquired prior to 2000 there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the financial statements. Subsequently no individual item has cost more than £1,000 so all such expenditure has been written off when incurred.

No cost information is available for the Vicar's house as it is deemed the property of the diocese.

All investments are valued at market value at 31st December 2013.

Reserves Policy

The PCC have agreed on a reserves policy which will be reviewed annually.

The reserves policy at the end of 2013 was set as follows;

- It is the policy of the church to hold in reserves the equivalent of three months basic running costs.
- It is also our policy to hold designated funds in reserves for building related expenses expected to arise within the next two years relating to the vicarage, the Mission House and the church building.
- It is also our policy to hold designated funds in reserves to guarantee the completion of any employment contracts for the term agreed.
